WHAT'S HAPPENING IN CANBERRA?

So much happened in Canberra in September and October.

I am a member of several different committees, including the House Economics Committee and the Deputy Chair of the Parliamentary Joint Committee for Law Enforcement. In both roles I continue to advocate for the people of Cowan.

In my position on the House Economics Committee, I attended hearings on APRA and the RBA inquiries into the Four Big Banks and discussed the Banking Royal Commission's recommendations.

I was on the ABC program "Q&A" on September 9. On the program we discussed the proposal to **drug test recipients of Newstart and Youth Allowance**; we also talked about Parliamentarian integrity and the Australian economy.

I was also lucky enough to catch up with around 100 Year 6 students from **Kingsway Christian College** during their Canberra trip. We had a lot of fun singing and chatting.

In the Parliament, I spoke about how the Coalition's lack of economic plan is failing the people of Cowan and the irresponsible policy of indiscriminately drug testing welfare recipients.

I've also been selected to take part in the high-profile Joint Select Committee on **Australia's**Family Law System. Given my experience with the family law system, I will be using this opportunity to make sure

we try to bring **reconciliation to families across Australia** - not dig up hurt and pit people against each other. More information regarding this Committee and any hearings will be available from my office.

We had a big week for multiculturalism in October. The Australian Indian and Hindu communities held an incredible Diwali and Annakut exhibition around the various festivals that these communities hold. The Bahá'í community also celebrated the bicentennary of the Birth of the Bab. It was fantastic to have these communities in Parliament House.

I am so pleased to **Chair a new Labor Caucus Committee on multicultural affairs**. Australia is a multicultural nation, and we need to ensure that the policies we develop work for all Australians.

DID YOU KNOW?

Since the Liberal-National Government expanded the robodebt scheme, over eight hundred thousand debt letters have been sent to people on welfare.

Already, 20% of these are wrong debt notices including notices to 169 deceased people. This leaves many Australians too scared to fight back.

The Morrison Government is using these false allegations of debt to prop up their Budget surplus. Labor has raised this issue in Federal Parliament by supporting a class action case on robodebt.
