A LIBERAL BUDGET: AUSTRALIANS BEING LEFT BEHIND

CUTTING JOB SUPPORT

The Morrison Government is cutting the JobSeeker and JobKeeper payments. Slashing these payments mean that some businesses will no longer be able to afford to employ local workers and support local jobs.

Scott Morrison and Josh Frydenberg are cutting wages to hardworking Australians, with people on minimum wage set to lose up to \$300 a week from their pay packet.

NO PLAN FOR JOBS

Before the last election the Liberals promised funding for an Industry Training Hub in Wanneroo. They promised it was coming this year but there is no funding for this much needed Training Hub in the budget.

I have written to Minister Cash and spoken in Parliament to hold the Government to account over this promise.

Now is the time for the Federal Government to be investing in training and jobs in Perth's northern suburbs.

A LABOR BUDGET: JOBS FOR TODAY

BOOSTING MANUFACTURING

This Liberal Government has a terrible record with Australian manufacturing. Scott Morrison and the Liberals drove Ford and Holden out of Australia. Australia can and should be a country that makes things.

Just like the McGowan Government has been doing in WA, a Federal Labor Government will support building trains in Australia with local workers. Federal funding will provide job opportunities and boost industry.

The Defence Industry Development Strategy will be a \$270 billion investment to develop industrial and research capabilities to build skills and expertise within the Australian workforce.

A Labor Government will start an Australian Skills Guarantee to give apprentices, trainees and cadets a foot in the door to work on major Commonwealth projects.

AFFORDABLE CHILDCARE

Working parents should be able to afford childcare for their kids. No one should be penalised for working extra days. Affordable childcare kickstarts the economy and gets Australians back to work.

A Labor Government will introduce the Working Family Childcare Boost to cut childcare fees and put more money into the pockets of working families.

Labor will:

- ✓ Scrap the \$10,560 childcare subsidy cap which often sees women penalised if they work an extra day a week.
- ✓ Lift the maximum childcare subsidy rate to 90%.
- ✓ Increase childcare subsidy rates for every family earning less than \$530,000.

This means 97% of all families in the system will save between \$600 to \$2,900. No family will be worse off.

INVESTING IN SOCIAL HOUSING

The Coalition has racked up over a trillion dollars debt with no plans to address the social housing crisis and no plans to give tradies sustained work.

The housing construction industry supports about a million people, a lot of them are tradies and 25% of Australia's social housing needs urgent repairs.

Labor will invest \$500 million to fast-track these repairs and create jobs for local workers.
